The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) for B.A. Honours in Nepali Language and Literature at the University of North Bengal (NBU) follows the structure outlined in the New Education Policy (NEP) 2020. Here is an overview:

Course Structure:

Core Courses (CC):

14 mandatory core courses spread across eight semesters.

Topics include Nepali prose, poetry, drama, literary criticism, and history of Nepali literature.

Elective Courses:

Discipline-Specific Electives (DSE): Advanced courses in specific areas of interest.

Generic Electives (GE): Courses from other disciplines to broaden knowledge.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):

Focus on practical skills like translation, creative writing, and oral traditions.

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):

Courses on Environmental Science and English/MIL are compulsory for all students.

Research and Internship:

Includes opportunities for research projects and internships in the final year.

Semester-wise Breakdown:

Semesters 1-2:

Introduction to Nepali language and literature, basics of prose, poetry, and history.

Semesters 3-4:

Intermediate courses focusing on drama, literary theories, and criticism. Skill enhancement courses.

Semesters 5-6:

Advanced literature topics, contemporary and classical works. Discipline-specific electives.

Semesters 7-8:

Research methodology, critical analysis. Internship and dissertation projects.

Credits and Evaluation:

Each course carries a specific number of credits, usually between 4 to 6. The total credit requirement for the Honours degree is around 160 credits. Evaluation includes internal assessments and end-semester exams.
